

Introduction

The MA Geopolitics and the Global Economy is the most popular Graduate degree programme offered by the School of Geography (admitting 10-15 students each year) and has been in existence for over a decade. It is led by Professor Alun Jones, Member of the Irish Academy and Academia Europea, and Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences in the UK. It equips students with an in-depth understanding of critical political geographies and geopolitics, international relations, war and diplomacy as well as global economic processes.

The programme is designed to enhance conceptual understanding, analytical abilities, and practical skill sets through small group teaching, appraisal of up to date readings, and student engagement with geopolitics through face to face interviews with political elites and diplomat practitioners. To this end, high-level fieldwork in Brussels is offered exclusively for students on this programme.

- This programme is intended for applicants with a degree in geography or a related discipline including political science, history, economics and sociology, or professionals working in related fields.
- Applicants should have a minimum of an upper second class honours (2.1) degree or international equivalent at Bachelors level.

- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
