Introduction

This is a taught Masters degree programme designed to respond to the interests and needs of education professionals who would like to develop their strengths and interests to an advanced level. It provides an opportunity to study a range of topics from within the broad field of education theory, policy and practice and to engage in close study to minor thesis level.

The focus is to develop critical skills of inquiry as students examine and deliberate on key issues relating to education both nationally and internationally.

The programme offers several elective modules in Educational Sciences and Professional Development.

Students are exposed to a range of research skills and techniques which enable them to engage with, and produce, high quality educational research.

The MA Ed is a 90 credit degree programme taken over one year full time. The students are required to take three taught core modules, four option modules and they complete a 20 credit thesis. The modules are completed across trimester one, two and three. The thesis is submitted at the end of trimester three.

- Applicants will normally hold an honours degree at undergraduate level (or equivalent) from a recognized higher education institution.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must provide a Certificate of Proficiency in English. An overall IELTS score of 6.5 with no area falling below 6 is required.
- Applicants may be interviewed either in person or via Zoom.
