# MA/MSc Politics (One Year Full Time)

The MA/MSc Politics degree was developed for those who wish to understand the role of politics in shaping the great issues of our day including power and conflict, distribution and inequality, relations between nations, and the new challenges of globalisation, financial crisis, national security and climate change. The course focuses on the two traditional pillars of the discipline – political theory and comparative politics. You will examine regime types, political stability, change and crisis, and electoral and party systems; and explore ideas about freedom, equality, citizenship and rights. You will acquire an understanding of European nation-states in a comparative perspective.

You may choose to study for an MA or MSc qualification in Politics. The MSc track includes additional research components and is particularly suitable if you want a career in research or academia. The MA track is broader and allows you to choose to complete a dissertation or apply for an internship to develop your professional skills in the field.

- This programme is intended for applicants with a degree in a relevant subject such as political science, international relations, social science, sociology, history, geography, economics, global studies, public policy, development studies, EU studies, law. An upper second class honours, or international equivalent is required.
- Your application will be considered on its individual merits and relevant professional experience will also be taken into account.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
