Professional Diploma in Employment Law

Legislation regulating relations in the workplace has increased dramatically over the last decades. The programme will provide students with a detailed knowledge and understanding of all aspects of the law relating to employment and workplace relations, both domestic and European.



Your studies

The course content includes the nature of a contract of employment and all its attendant rights and obligations, with a focus on employment equality, unfair dismissal, payment of wages, domestic leave, and workplace privacy. The content also includes lectures on the law of industrial conflict, the constitutional guarantee of freedom of association, bullying, whistleblowing and stress at work, and the role of bodies such as the Workplace Relations Commission and the Labour Court. The assessment strategy involves a written assignment, participation in a group project, and an examination.

Your future

The Diploma is not just for barristers or solicitors, but also for trade union/employer association officials, personnel managers, and human resources/industrial relations practitioners. Applications will be considered from the holders of such academic and/or professional qualifications, and/or such experience as would satisfy the School that they are able to participate fully in all aspects of the programme.
