MA/MSc International Development (One Year Full time)

The MSc in International Development is designed to provide you with an interdisciplinary understanding of the process of development by bringing together expertise in politics, economics, agriculture, political economy and other areas. You will examine challenges such as the reduction of inequality and exclusion, the expansion of economic and social choices, the progressive realisation of human rights, and the argument for sustainable development. You will acquire a range of skills to enable you to work effectively in the development field.

A wide range of specialisations are available to enable you to select areas where you wish to develop your expertise. You may choose to study for an MA or MSc qualification in international relations. The MSc track includes additional research components including a dissertation and is particularly suitable if you want a career in research or academia. The MA track is broader and allows you to choose to complete a dissertation or apply for an internship.

Selected MA students may complete an internship in lieu of a dissertation.

Entry Requirements

- This programme is intended for applicants with an upper second class honours primary degree, or the international equivalent in a subject area such as political science, international relations, social science, sociology, history, geography, economics, global studies, public policy, development studies, EU studies, law.
- Relevant professional experience will be taken into account.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
