<p>Biography:</p>

<p>Marina Carr's internationally celebrated work has been produced around the world, in venues such as The Abbey Theatre, The Gate, Druid, The Royal Court, Wyndhams Theatre, The RSC, The Tricycle, The MacCarter Theatre, San Diego Rep and Milwaukee Rep. Her plays include 'The Mai, 1994; 'Portia Coughlan, 1996; 'By the Bog of Cats, 1998; 'On Raftery's Hill, 1999; 'Ariel, 2000; 'Woman and Scarecrow, 2004; and 'Marble, 2007; The RSC produced the world premiere of her reimagining of 'Hecuba at the Swan Theatre in September 2015, and in August 2015 the Abbey Theatre produced a major revival of 'By the Bog of Cats. Her reimagining of 'Anna Karenina played for two months in the Abbey Theatre finishing end of January 2017.</p>

<p>Prizes include 'The Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, 'The American/Ireland Fund Award, 'The E.M. Forster Award from the 'American Academy of Arts and Letters, 'The Macauley Fellowship, 'The Peterbaugh Fellowship and most recently 'The Windham-Campbell Prize. Marina is a graduate of University College Dublin and lectures in the English department at Dublin City University.</p>
