<h1 class="pageTitle">POL40820 Governing the Global Economy</h1>
<h2>Academic Year 2019/2020</h2>

This module will introduce students to Critical Political Economy (CPE) as a conceptual basis for understanding development and change in the global economy and, in particular, how that economy is politically governed. A key theme of the module is the centrality of political institutions and ideas in moulding and determining economic outcomes and, more generally, the interconnectedness of politics and economics. A neo-Gramscian approach is adopted, showing how concepts such as hegemony and critical theory can help explain why and how institutions, ideas and economic relations change over time. One such change is embedded in the idea of development, and the (contested) role of the state in the promotion of economic development is one theme that will be explored early in the module with particular reference to the idea of the developmental state.

We then turn our attention to descending layers of economic governance, beginning at the global level with an analysis of the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund and the World Trade Organisation, as well as the way in which development finance (including aid) helps govern the global economy. Regional governance is our next port of call, chiefly consisting of a detailed case-study of the currently fast changing political economy of the European Union. And our last layer is national economic governance, again built around a case study, in this case the political economy of states and markets in the Republic of Ireland. Finally, we use the tools of CPE to explore the current economic and climate crises and to ask whether fundamental shifts are taking place in global economics and politics.
