

This module provides credit for participation in archaeological excavations, laboratory projects or equivalent during the summer break (June to August 2019).

Students may gain skills in several different areas, dependent on the project: for example, excavation, finds analysis, sample processing, administrative or survey work, on projects based in Ireland or overseas.

Students will be required to undertake approximately four weeks of full-time work on a project and to complete a learning journal. Students who participate in a work placement will be manually enrolled to the module by the School of Archaeology for the academic year 2019/20.

Please note that many placements will require that students contribute a charge to cover transport/accommodation/food etc.
